1. Decide What to Include

Ask your students to focus on a specific topic. Talk about places they may have visited, books they read, people in their lives or something that they are interested in sharing about themselves.

3. Acquire Images

Point and shoot with the camera, use your scanner or search the web and find representative digital images. Upload the camera images to your computer and save all pictures to a folder that's easy for you to locate.

4. Create and Share the Collage

Use your graphics program to open, edit and place your images on a new 'canvas'. Add a title to personalize your collage

Save your collage as either a graphic or web document (aka HTML file)



Tip-Be sure to create a new folder to save all of the pictures AND your finished collage in it.

Share your collage. You can choose to print, email or post your graphic on a web site.
